The nature of the course



- Examination board: AQA
- Course contents:

40% Exam

Film Music, Jazz, Marriage of Figaro (Mozart), Baroque Concertos and Romantic Piano Music

25% Composition

Two compositions: One own choice, one responding to a brief.

35% Performance

Minimum of 12 minutes recorded. Grade V standard minimum

Examination structure



- Ability to apply and analyse music including recognising cadences, melody dictation, modulations and analysing a score.
- Written analysis of set works through a choice of essay titles.

- A minimum of a Grade V standard on at least one instrument.
- A passion for music and thirst to expand their musical horizons.
- An ability to work independently and be fully committed to the musical life of the school.
