Scholars



- It is the expectation that students in receipt of 11+ or 13+ subject scholarships will opt to study that subject at GCSE.
- In addition, scholarship students will continue to be expected to take a full and active role in extra-curricular programmes and enrichment opportunities in that subject.
- The continued award of subject scholarships is reviewed annually with a full review at the end of GCSE's.

Making the Right Choice



- Discuss subjects with Teachers, Tutors, HsMs, Heads of Department, the Head of Careers (Mrs Guzenda), Parents and older Students.
- Ask questions:
 - What is on the GCSE syllabus?
 - How is the syllabus taught? Is there coursework?
 - How much is practical based?

Making the Right Choice



- Try to achieve a good balance of subjects this will keep your future options open.
- Think about the <u>skills</u> that each subject will teach you a good balance between the arts, humanities and sciences will lead to a more rounded student. We would strongly recommend you consider continuing the study of at least one practical or creative subject to GCSE level.
- Don't focus too much on what career you think you want when you are older — you will probably change your mind many times before you get a job and chances are the job you will do does not exist

What is the English Baccalaureate (EBacc)?



The government has been promoting the study of a combination of GCSE subjects which they and the Russell Group of universities (at A-level) argue open more doors to more degrees and keep young people's options open for their future careers.

The EBacc consists of:

- English language and literature
- maths
- the sciences
- geography or history
- a language

Languages at Bloxham



- The Bloxham School Curriculum includes studying a language at GCSE
- We strongly believe that this prepares students for the global world in which they live
- Current 3rd Form students will have studied either French or Spanish for 5 years by the time exams are taken in Summer 2026
- The study of a language teaches perseverance, dedication and resilience
